



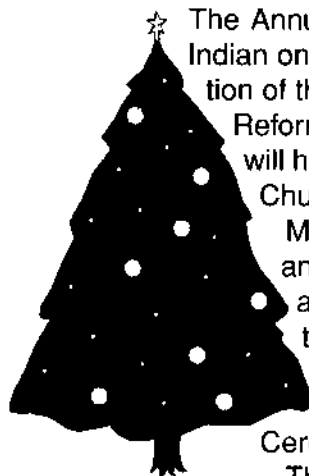

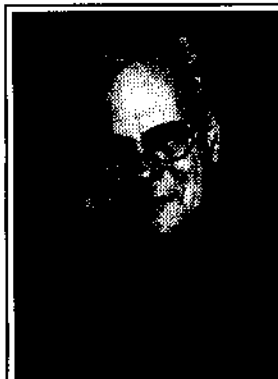

Stockade Assoc. Board Minutes, 11/ 9/04

Joe called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM.

Present: Joe Fava, Debbi Douglas, Diane DeMeo, Lyn Gordon, Dale Miller, Connie Colangelo, Peter Rumora, Bob Preville, Fred Kindl and Kim Mabee.

Peter moved to approve the minutes of the October 5th board meeting. Fred seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Old Business

Neighborhood Watch and Block Leaders

Dale presented a binder for the volunteer who will eventually take charge of reinvigorating a neighborhood watch program. Joe will speak to the general membership regarding the urgent need and importance for people to participate in this program.

Master Plan

Dale presented a draft outline of ideas for a master plan for the Stockade. We will need volunteers to form a master plan committee, review the current draft and move the ideas forward. Discussion followed, including the benefit of having a master plan in place when applying for grant funding. Peter recommended we compose a narrative reflecting our goals as a neighborhood. Lyn feels that if we have a professional master plan, we are more likely to apply to larger foundations to fund projects. Fred, Dale, Joe and Peter will start up this committee.

Treasurer's Report/Budget

Lyn presented the treasurer's report, and after discussion, Peter made a motion to accept the report. Bob seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. Bob walked the board through the budget as of 11/10/04. After discussion on the budget and the budget format, Peter congratulated Bob and Lyn for the terrific job of putting the budget together. Bob will present it at the general meeting. Connie made a motion to accept the budget as of 11/10. Deb seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Lawrence Update

Peter and Connie reported that the City of Schenectady will not be supplying power or water to Lawrence, due to current budget constraints. For now, we will continue to maintain Lawrence through the generosity of the neighbors.

Promotion

Lyn reported back to the board regarding prices for banners from Matthew Signs. Connie made a motion to approve the purchase of a 2 X 6 banner that we can use at events. Fred seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

New Business

Other

An article from the October SPY, "Time Immemorial," was discussed. The board discussed the opinions presented by the author, and after discussion, it was agreed that at the time, the *neighbors* agreed to change the name of the park to Riverside Park. It was also agreed that we will request that a disclaimer statement be included in each edition of the Spy to indicate that the articles do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the board.

Nominating Procedure

Lyn suggested that we post a notice in the SPY calling for any volunteers interested in serving on the board. The procedure was discussed, including a suggestion by Deb to encourage candidates to submit their interest in serving on the board.

On-going Parking Issue

Connie introduced discussion regarding the on-going issue of traffic and the increasing parking problem, specifically around Lawrence. There was discussion as to some current reasons and the concerns of the neighbors in that area.

Historical Society

Kim requested that the board consider reinstating its practice of appointing a member to attend the SCHS board meetings, with the intent of keeping apprised of the organization's current business, as Kim attends the Association board meetings. The board agreed, discussed the request and will take steps to move this partnership forward.

Committee Reports

Garden Group

We will ask Steve Kowalski to come to the December board meeting to discuss integrating the garden group finances back under the Association for purposes of following the by-laws and state/federal reporting.

Walkabout

We will be re-defining roles for next year's Walkabout, and we will invite John Samatulski to the December board meeting to discuss several projects.

Kerst Kermis

Diane reported plans for the December 5 event are right on track. She was pleased to announce that Marshall and Sterling will sponsor one of the carriages, and that the Gazette has donated advertising space. Volunteers are still sought.

Fred moved to adjourn the meeting at 9:13. Deb seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

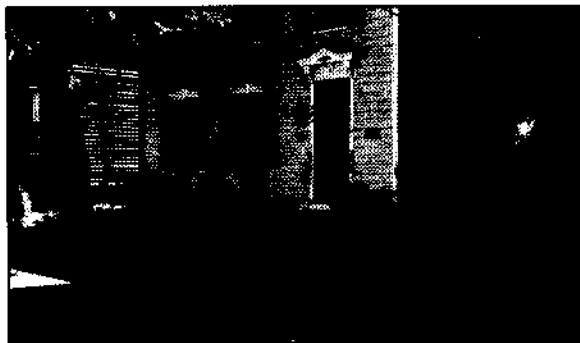

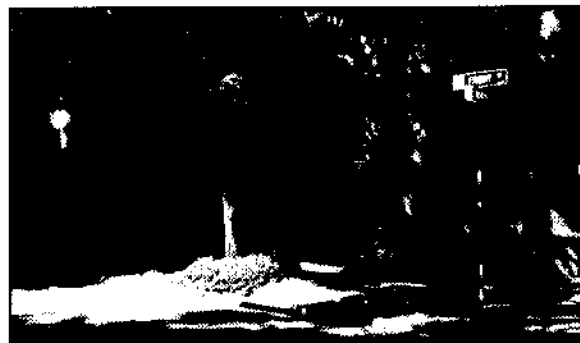
